I Rebecca Adams of Bowdoinham in the County of Lincoln and State of Maine, aged Seventy five years, do, upon oath declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I am the widow of Jedediah Adams late of Bowdoinham in the County of Lincoln and State of Maine, who died at Bowdoinham on the seventeenth day of July A. D. 1833

That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, Jedediah Adams did enlist into Capt. Ballard's company Col. Allen's Regt of the Mass. line in the Revolution for three years in the year 1777 & was discharged at West Point in the year 1780 having recd an honorable discharge & serving the full period of three years. he was for the above service upon the pension roll of the U. States of the Maine agency at the time of his decease

I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, Jedediah Adams was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of the then District of Maine in Lincoln County and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in Bowdoinham aforesaid, where he had resided for Several years before his decease. That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, (nor have I received since his decease,) a grant of Land, or money in lieu thereof, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.

And my said Attorney is hereby authorized and empowered upon the receipt of said certificate, for me and in my name, to execute such receipt or acknowledgment therefor, as I might, were I personally present.
